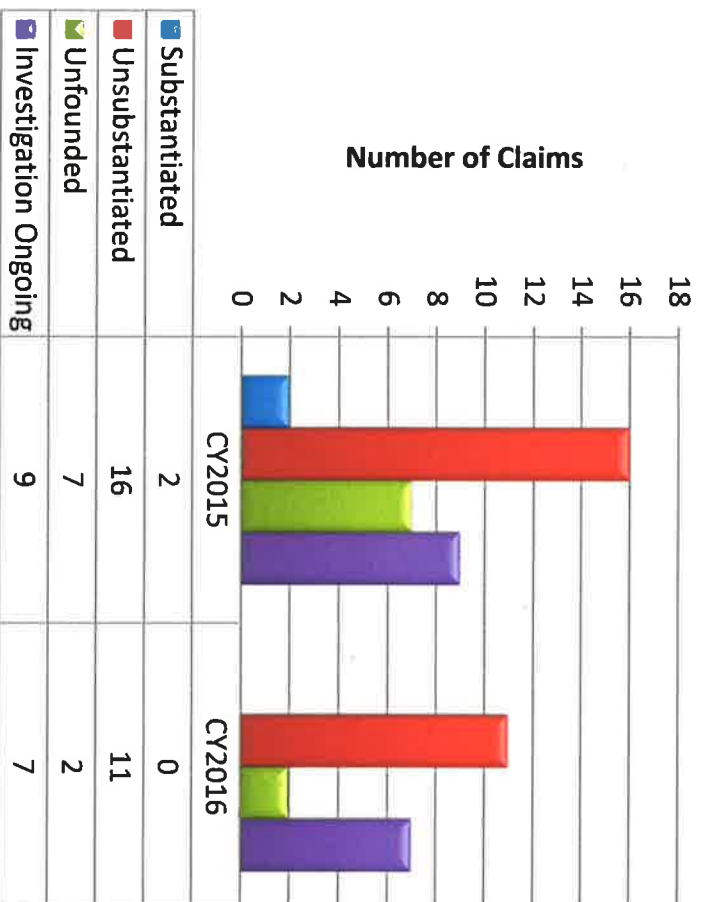


# PREA: Detecting, Reporting, Preventing

## Offender – on – Offender Nonconsensual Sexual Acts

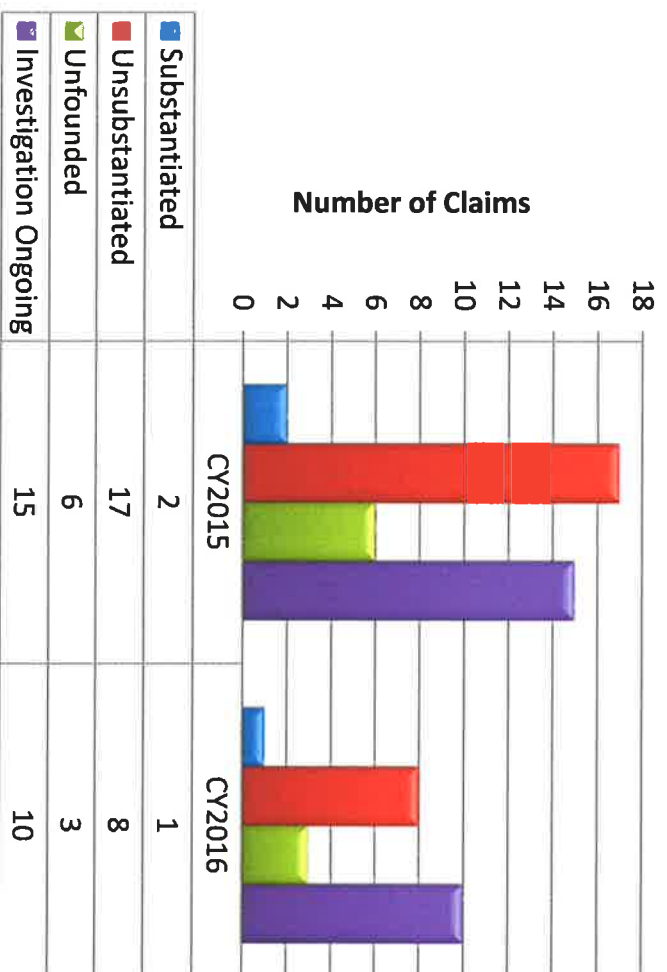
Contact between the penis and vagina or the penis and the anus including penetration, however slight; or contact between the mouth and the penis, vagina or anus; or penetration of the anus or genital opening of another person by a hand, finger or other object.



# PREA: Detecting, Reporting, Preventing

## Offender – on – Offender Abusive Sexual Acts

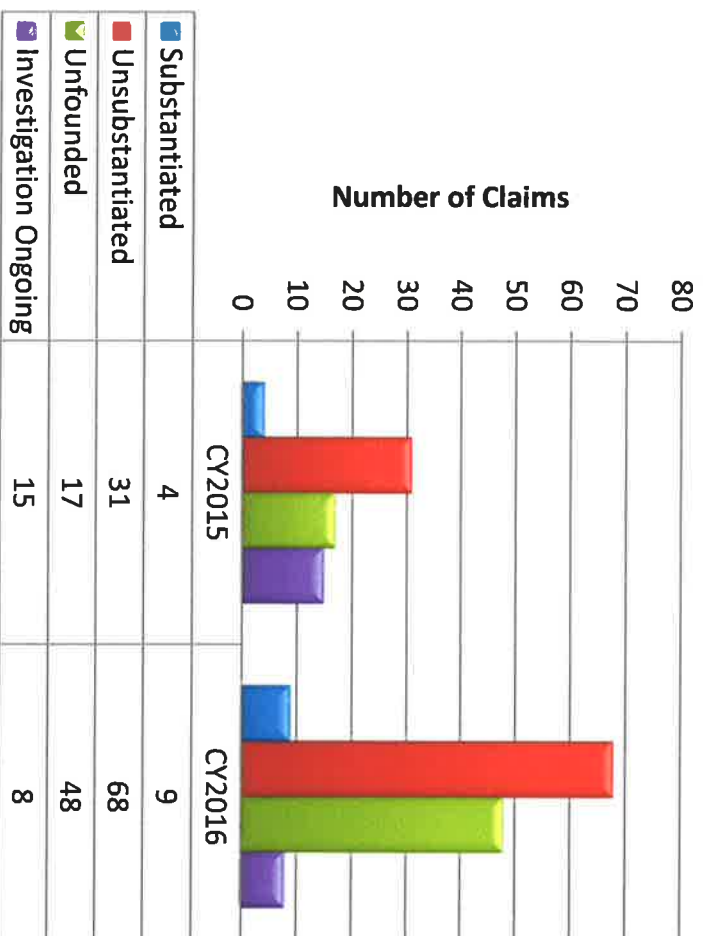
Intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh or buttocks of any person. Incidents in which the intention is to sexually exploit (rather than harm or debilitate).



# PREA: Detecting, Reporting, Preventing

## Offender – on – Offender Sexual Harassment

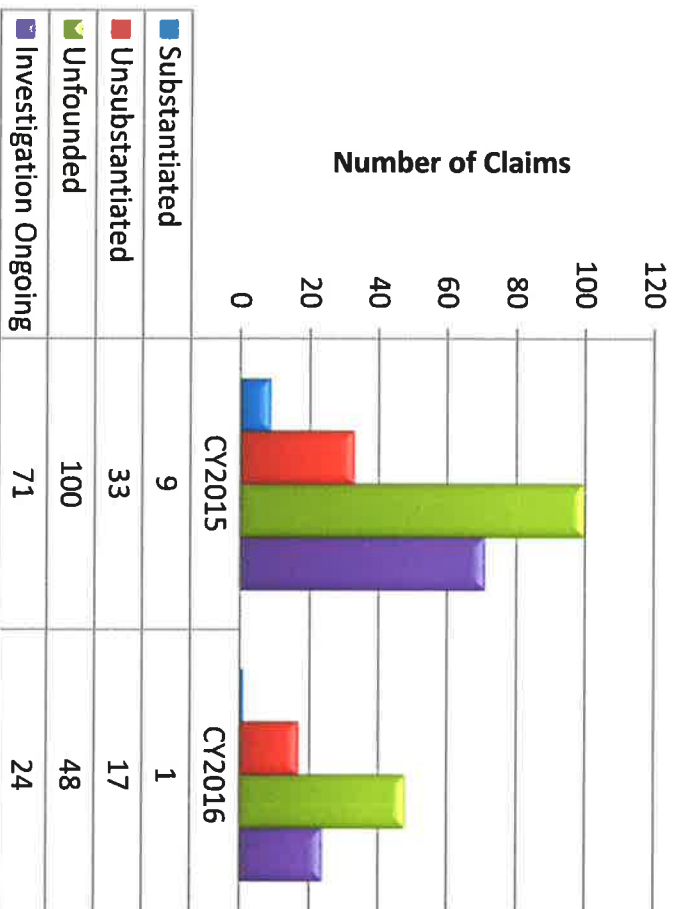
Repeated and unwanted sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one offender directed toward another



# PREA: Detecting, Reporting, Preventing

## Staff Sexual Misconduct

Any behavior or act of a sexual nature, whether consensual or nonconsensual, directed towards an inmate by an employee, volunteer, official visitor or agency representative. Such acts include: intentional touching of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh or buttocks with the intent to abuse, arouse or gratify sexual desire; or completed, attempted, threatened, or requested sexual acts; or occurrences of indecent exposure, invasion of privacy or staff voyeurism for sexual gratification.

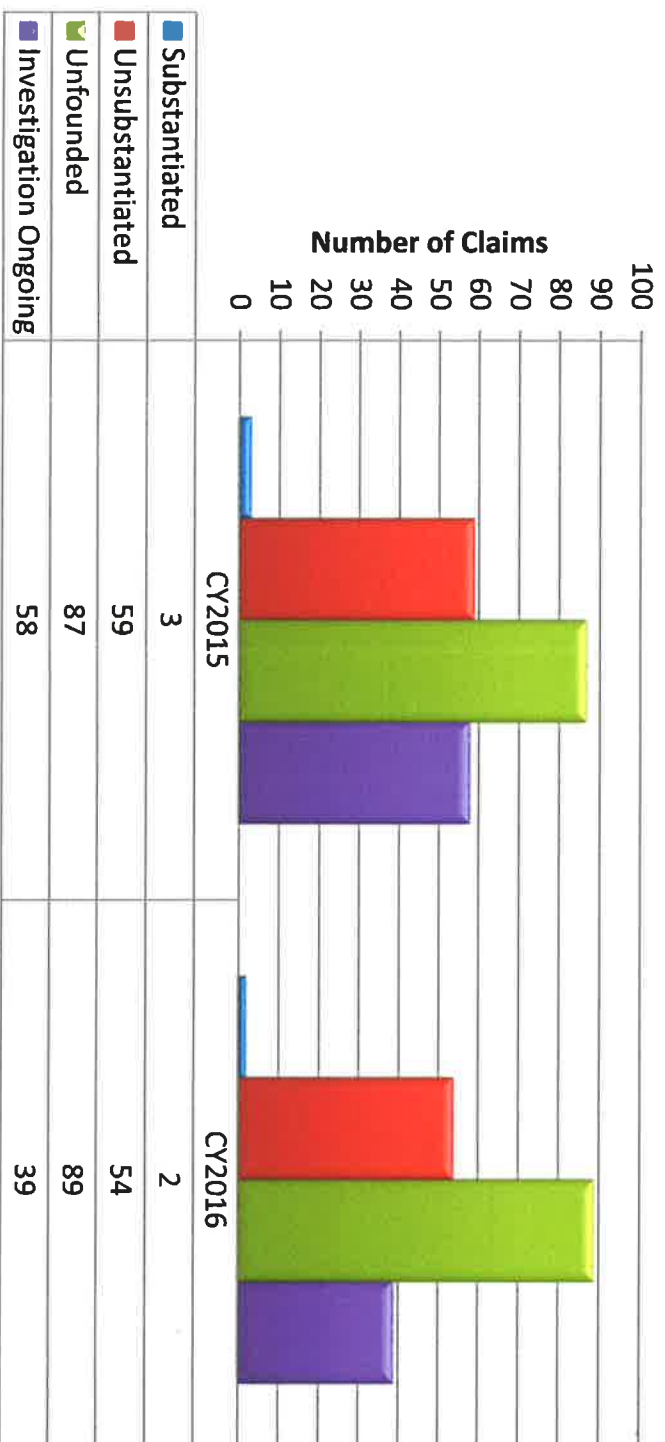


# PREA: Detecting, Reporting, Preventing

## Staff Sexual Harassment

Repeated\* verbal statements or comments of a sexual nature to an inmate by an employee, volunteer, official visitor or agency representative. Such statements include demeaning references to gender or derogatory comments about body or clothing; or profane or obscene language or gestures.

\*Please note that in 2014 the definition change eliminated repeated



# Corrective Actions

- **Central Region**

- Baskerville Correctional Center**

- Cameras were installed in the following locations

- Rear Housing Unit 2 and 3, Print shop Front and Rear, Laundry Area, Kitchen Rear, Inmate Dining, Dishwasher Area, Serving Line, Kitchen Prep Area, Grill Area, Wash Area, Freezer Area, and Dry Storage Area, Housing Unit 2#-3# Entry A side and B side, Rear A side and B Side, Segregation Area (B Side).

- Deep Meadow Correctional Center**

- Windows were installed in the mental health trailer in all of the office doors. In addition, windows were installed in the offender restroom in Building 5 and in the offender bathroom in the kitchen area.

- Dillwyn Correctional Center**

- Installed a holding cage in the medical area. Installed a mirror in the trailer classroom, and added windows to the two office doors and exterior door in the trailer.

- Fluvanna Correctional Center**

- Windows installed in the shakedown rooms at front entry. A second Intelligence Officer was hired to assist with investigations.

- Lunenburg Correctional Center**

- The Center aisle beds were cut down to increase visibility. Installation of a new rapid eye camera system began in July 2016.

# Corrective Actions Continued

## • Eastern Region

### **Haynesville Correctional Unit #17**

Cameras installed throughout the facility-August 2016

### **Lawrenceville Correctional Center**

2 additional cameras were installed inside the gatehouse of the rear Sally port in October 2016.

### **Indian Creek Correctional Center**

Three solid facility doors were replaced with doors with windows to allow viewing inside the area (2 –Kitchen, 1 – Enterprise) -May 2016.

### **Greenville Correctional Center and Work Center**

Urinals were removed from recreation yards for PREA compliance. Cameras were purchased and installed in the Men's Work Center, Housing Units 1, Housing Unit 2, and Housing Unit 3.

# Corrective Actions

- **Western Region**

- Appalachian Men's Detention Center**

- Improved the ability to monitor the detainee restroom in the living area by moving some of the detainee beds.

- Bland Correctional Center**

- An Institutional Investigative Hotline was added which allows offenders to place a direct call to the Investigator's office.

- Cold Springs Detention Center**

- Improved the ability to monitor the detainee restroom in the living area by moving some of the detainee beds.

- Cold Springs Correctional Unit**

- Dividers were installed in the showers.

- Green Rock Correctional Center**

- Two cameras were added to the stock room in the kitchen.

- Harrisonburg Men's Diversion Center**

- Window film was put on the windows adjacent to the bathrooms to obstruct the view from the recreation yard. A panel extension was added in the bathroom.

- Keen Mountain Correctional Center**

- During the renovation process additional upgraded cameras were installed.

- Marion Correctional Treatment Center**

- Received seven 27" LED monitors for Administrative Duty Officers and two 70" monitors for the Warden and Investigative office. The additional monitors allow for more efficient viewing of the camera system and Rapid Eye.



# Corrective Actions

- **Western Region**

- Patrick Henry Correctional Unit**

- Installed swinging doors in the electrical school restroom.

- Pocahontas State Correctional Center**

- Buildings & Grounds staff have replaced the cracked and broken “privacy covers” for the doors on two offender shower cells in the Restrictive Housing Unit.

- Red Onion State Prison**

- Added an extended shower curtain in one of the pods to prevent viewing into the shower.

- Started transitioning to a new camera system that is estimated to be completed and fully operational by February 1, 2017.

- River North Correctional Center**

- A gate was added in the Department of Education restrooms to limit one offender in the restroom at a time. Windows in the Department of Education restrooms were partially frosted.

- Wallens Ridge State Prison**

- Updated the security camera system to a fully digital Honeywell H4D system.

- Wise Correctional Unit**

- Dividers were installed in the showers. Two additional cameras were added in the stairwell to the basement.

# Summary & Comparison


- Increase in call/reporting volumes from 2015 to 2016
  - Calls received on the PREA Hotline increased by approximately 232 calls
  - Decrease in staff sexual misconduct and staff sexual harassment claims
  - Increase in the number of offender-on-offender sexual harassment allegations
  - Additional information was provided to offenders regarding the appropriate use of the PREA Hotline
- Regional PREA Analyst continue visiting facilities to ensure PREA Compliance
- Successfully completed 7 audits, with no facilities entering into a Corrective Action Period
- Staff and Partner Training
  - Additional training provided to Action Alliance advocates
  - Provided training to Investigators and PREA Compliance Managers through two statewide conferences
- VADOC PREA Unit is continuing working on their grant projects
  - DCJS – 59K to purchase cameras for Bland Correctional Center
    - 3 year partnership with Just Detention International (JDI) and University of Virginia
      - The Offender Peer Education Program is successfully operating at 3 pilot sites
      - Cultural surveys were collected to assist with training modification
    - JDI conducted Mock Audits at 3 facilities in preparation for upcoming PREA audits
